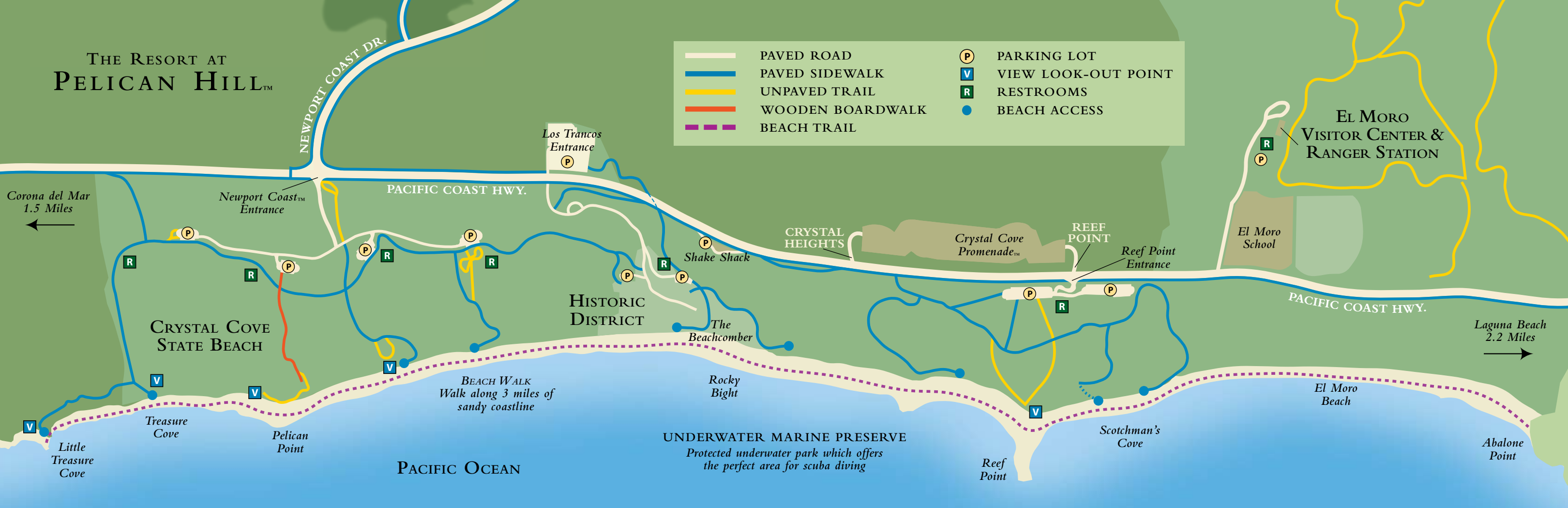

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## CRYSTAL COVE HISTORIC DISTRICT:

Beginning in the 1920s, people traveled the new Pacific Coast Highway to spend their free time at the beach. Crystal Cove soon became a popular place to camp or rent a cottage.

By the 1930s, the last of the current 46 cottages was built and the beach became a private community.

The enclave was placed on the National Register of Historic Places for its unique vernacular architecture in 1979 and the land was sold to the state of California.

The cottage leases expired in 2005 and are now being restored by the California State Parks for public use.



## HISTORIC DISTRICT AMENITIES:

### SHAKE SHACK

This nostalgic snack bar, situated high on the bluff, features cold drinks, thick shakes, a selection of sandwiches, hotdogs, chili and snacks.

### THE BEACHCOMBER®

Dine on the sand at this charming restaurant that serves breakfast, lunch and dinner. There is also an outdoor, covered bar where you can enjoy a cocktail while watching the waves crash or the sunset.

Restrooms and a small gift shop are also located in the district.

## BEACH ACTIVITIES:

There are seven separate coves along the 3.2 miles of beach, offering spectacular sunbathing, swimming, surfing, diving and tide pool exploration.

There are restrooms and outdoor showers conveniently located at the trail heads near the parking lots.

## BACKCOUNTRY TRAILS:

There is access to 2,400 undeveloped acres from the El Moro Visitor Center parking lot. The trails are for hiking, biking and equestrian use. Maps are available at the ranger station.

6:00 am to sunset year round

## HISTORIC DISTRICT HOURS:

6:00 am to 10:00 pm

## PLEASE REMEMBER:

Alcohol is not permitted in the park except when purchased and consumed at The Beachcomber.

Tide pools are protected by California State Law. Collection of shells and rocks is prohibited.

Please stay on established trails and do not approach or climb on cliff-faces which are unstable.

No fires are allowed on the sand. Hibachis or barbecues are permitted, gas canister type only.
